



CONFISCATION OF POSSIBLE ILLICIT GOODS FROM DEALERS

Second-Hand Goods Act, 2009 (Act No. 6 of 2009)



STEP 1

IDENTIFY

The Police Member identifies him/herself by producing his/her Appointment Certificate to the Dealer and explains the purpose of his/her visit

STEP 2

INFORM

The Police Member informs the Dealer about the facts pertaining to the alleged Illicit Goods and provides the Case Number (CAS) applicable on the investigation to the dealer

STEP 3

ISSUE

The Police Member issues an SAPS 13(b) to the Dealer upon confiscation of the Illicit Goods (or at least within 24 hours should circumstances prohibits the immediate issuing thereof)

STEP 4

UPDATE

The Dealer as well as the Police Member updates and signs the Dealer Stock Register and records the CAS as well as SAPS 13 numbers in the "Comments" column thereof

STEP 5

COMPLETE

The Police Member completes both the SAPS 607 Visitation Registers kept on the premises of the Dealer and at the office of the DSO (Police Station)

STEP 6

PROVIDE

The Police Member regularly provides the Dealer with progress relating to the Investigation and Disposal of the alleged Illicit Goods
